**DESCRIPTION:**

This collection documents the reign of King [REDACTED] III of [REDACTED] during the Hundred Years' War. The manuscripts were originally housed at [REDACTED] before being transferred to the Tower of [REDACTED] in [REDACTED].

**HISTORICAL CONTEXT:**
